WHEREAS, Pursuant to the Illinois Election Code, 10 ILCS 5/28-1 et seq., and the Illinois Counties Code, 55 ILCS 5/5-1005.5, by a vote of the majority of the members of the county board, the board may authorize an advisory question of public policy to be placed on the ballot at the next regularly scheduled election in the county; and

WHEREAS, The County Board hereby intends to submit to the residents of Franklin County a public question of county-wide significance; and

WHEREAS, The County Board believes it is in the best interest of the residents of Franklin County to move expeditiously as possible to submit this proposition to the voters at the next regularly scheduled general election to be held on November 6, 2018; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF FRANKLIN COUNTY:

Section 1. The above recitals are expressly incorporated herein and made part hereof as though fully set forth herein.

Section 2. The County Board of Franklin County does hereby initiate and authorize the following public question to be submitted to the voters of Franklin County at the regularly scheduled general election next occurring after the effective date of this resolution, on November 6, 2018:

"Should the Illinois General Assembly amend the state constitution to ban the implementation of a statewide 1% property tax increase."
