AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into between the Franklin County Board, a body Politic, hereafter referred to as "Board", and Ward Consulting, an Independent Contractor, hereafter referred to as "Ward".

ONE

WHEREAS the Board is desirous of obtaining the services of personnel for the purpose of implementation and management of its Waste Management Policy; and,

WHEREAS due to prior experience with said Policy, Ward is most qualified to undertake said implementation and initial management; and,

WHEREAS Ward is willing to undertake the duties of said implementation and management under the terms and conditions herein contained; now,

THEREFORE the parties hereto agree to the following terms and conditions.

TWO

The **TERM** of this contract shall be for Two (2) Years, commencing June 1, 2015 to May 30, 2017, and to be extended thereafter upon terms and conditions agreeable to both parties.

THREE

COMPENSATION for the position shall be set at Twelve Thousand Dollars per year, payable in equal installments as agreed to by the parties;

FOUR

The **NATURE OF THE EMPLOYMENT** shall be one of Independent Contractor, and Ward will be entitled to no benefits of employment over and above the salary stated in paragraph Three, above.

FIVE

Ward will, as part of his **DUTIES**, perform the following functions;

- 1. Design and implement a Waste Management Policy for Franklin County in Compliance with applicable statute;
- 2. Design and /or secure the necessary enabling ordinances, compliance forms, registration forms, etc, and manage and file same in a reasonable manner;
- 3. Perform such day to day functions, such as fulfilling reporting requirements, as may be

required by law;

4. Report violations of the law to appropriate enforcement agencies;5. Perform such other duties as may be required by statute and ordinance;
