SSOS Grant Program (State-wide System of Support) (Replacing RESPRO)

- The Franklin-Williamson Regional Office of Education #21 was awarded the SSOS Fiscal Agent Grant for FY14 for Area VI of the IARSS. This grant period began 7/1/2013.

initiatives have been added: Common Core English Language Arts (ELA); Common Core Math; Rising Star/Continuous Improvement Planning ; Evaluation/Danielson ; PARCC/Balanced Assessment; Family Engagement; Science.

- Two Area Coordinators are in place for each of the five initiatives for a limited number of days. They participated in a State-Level training for each initiative and will have conference calls throughout this year. They are providing ROE level training in Area VI. Up to two representatives from each ROE in Area VI have attended these training. The ROE representatives will take this training back to districts and schools in their respective regions. 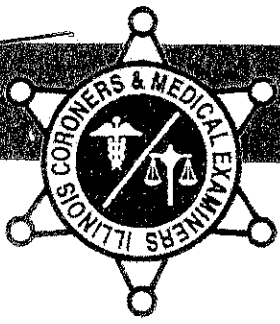

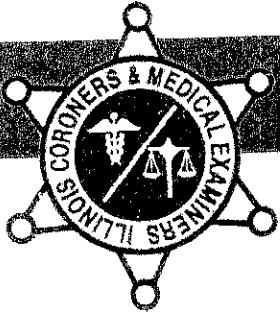
